Registration Fees: Registration fee for this event is \$12.00 per person (youth or adult). Fee can be paid by e-transfer to 15thlethbridgetreasurer@gmail.com **Please indicate 'Beaveree' and your group name and group number in the notes of the etransfer.** Registration fee receipts will be emailed to the email provided on the registration form.

Sign In Package:

- A copy of your Approved Adventure Application Form (AFF) (All Colonies are required to receive their Group Commissioner approval and submit the form to archives).
- Note: All Scouters must be 'active' in myscouts to be eligible to attend.
- Copies of Registration Forms for each youth and Scouters attending the event.
- Copies of any Hold Harmless forms for unregistered Volunteers attending.
- Copies of Non-member Physical Fitness Forms for unregistered Volunteers attending the event.
- Notify us of any health, food allergies or behavioral concerns.
- Code of Conduct Forms for unregistered Volunteers attending.

Arrival and Parking; Please arrive between 9:00 am and 9:30 am to allow time for registration and setup of your station. Parking will be in the outer parking lot by the playground. The inner parking lot will be used for drop off of supplies and left open for any emergency vehicles. Please submit a copy of your Sign In Packages to the First Aid Station upon arrival. If anyone leaves before the end of day please sign out and/or back in with personnel at the First Aid Station.

Medical and Emergency Care: The First Aid Station will be located to the northeast of the Group B Shelter with a prominent sign. All injuries, even minor ones treated, must be brought to the attention of First Aid Station personnel for treatment and/or recording, all youth must be accompanied by a Scouter. Please submit a copy of your registration forms to the First Aid Station upon arrival. If there is an emergency requiring emergency services the call is to be made by the medical personnel only so there is no confusion or multiple calls.

Staff and Volunteers: An event such as this takes a lot of planning to make it run efficiently providing lots of fun for all of our beavers, if you have someone who is not needed to work with the youth and would like to volunteer please contact: Scouter Moira (TicTac) at (403-360-9930 or windstonebeaveree@gmail.com).

Fire Regulations: Individual campfires will not be allowed. We are only allowed to build one fire on the premises therefore, we will have one campfire. In the event of a FIRE, please keep all your people together in a safe location. Fire lanes and driveways must be kept clear for emergency equipment.

Bad Weather: Bad weather is not invited to the Windstone Beaveree. A designated volunteer will monitor Environment Canada, if a weather advisory or warning occurs, information will be provided and shared accordingly.

Garbage Disposal: Please put garbage in the bins provided, put recycling in the clear garbage bags and place in front of the Group B Shelter.

Drinkable Water: Please know that **drinkable water will be provided at the Shelter**, please do not use the site provided tap.

Electricity: Please know that there is no electricity available for this event. Please plan activities that do not require electricity.

Cell Phone Service: There is good cell phone service in this location.

Lunch: Hotdogs, veggie sticks, juice, and a bag of chips.

Off Limits Areas: Beavers, Scouters and Parents caught willfully causing damage to the facility or any other unit's equipment or property will be held financially responsible. Any behavior not consistent with Scouts Canada's bylaws, Policies and Procedures as well as the Code of Conduct should be brought to the attention of the event organizer. Please note that the Windstone Beaveree will not take responsibility for Colonies that do not follow the above Scouts Canada volunteer expectations. Please inform all beavers, parents, and Scouters that the Water and beach area is an off limits area. If a youth is found near or in the water, there are no exceptions, they will be asked to leave and go home.

Leave No Trace: Principles for kids (big and small):

- Know before you go
- Choose the right path
- Trash your trash
- Leave what you find
- Be careful with fire
- Respect wildlife
- Be kind to other visitors

Two Scouter Rule: The two Scouter Rule, is the requirement for two registered Scouters to be with youth at all times. Notwithstanding Section ratios, two Scouters must always be within the field of view and within earshot of one another when with youth. The Two Scouter rule is an integral part of the Code of Conduct that applies to all Scouts Canada Volunteers.

THE CHALLENGE:

Each Colony that attends will provide and execute one activity station (15 minute activity) that visits one area on 'The Pond Map'. We also challenge the Colonies to have their activity cover Outdoor Adventure Skills as well. Did you know that Beavers turns 50 years old this year? We challenge you to incorporate the number 50 in your activity to celebrate! Will you accept this challenge??!! On registration, you will be asked to provide 3 activities ideas. Once all the registrations have been received, we will contact the registrants to notify them of the activity that they will be doing (this will allow a more well rounded program) and **request a risk assessment for their activity.**

Special Instructions:

- 1. Full Uniform all youth and scouters.
- 2. Sign in Package (to be kept with the Venturers at the First Aid Station and to be returned at the end of the day, with receipt, and badges at clean-up).
- 3. Water bottles for each person/youth. We will have a refill station of potable water available.
- 4. Come prepared with a song, skit and cheer for the campfire.
- 5. Please bring a camera to take pictures and send some to windstonebeaveree@gmail.com!
- 6. Activity supplies (ie table, chairs, etc.).

Lost and Found: Lost and Found will be located at the Group B Shelter. Please return any found items to them and/or if you have lost something, please advise them, be sure to give not only a name but group name, address and contact number (if necessary).

Check – Out Procedures: Please go to the First Aid Station at Clean Up to retrieve your Sign In Package, receipt and badges.


